Story Mountain

- 1 Exposition:** In the beginning, the setting and characters are introduced. (Summarise what happens at the start)
- 2 Rising action/Conflict:** (Summarise how the character experiences the problem or tries to fix it.)
- 3 Climax/Turning point:** (The most exciting part of the story with the greatest tension.)
- 4 Falling Action:** (Summarise what happens after the conflict.)
- 5 Resolution:** The end (What does the character learn from the experience?)
